1. Curriculum Vitae: Marco Ramazzotti is professor of Archaeology and Art History of the Ancient Near East in the Sapienza University of Rome. He is director of the “Laboratory of the Analytical Archaeology and Artificial Adaptive Systems” (LAA&AAS), co-director of the “Atlas of the Ancient Near East” (AANE); co-director of the Italian-Omanite archaeological excavation at Daba (Oman). He combines researches on the relationships among Analytical Archaeology, Artificial Intelligence and Natural Computing and historical-artistic, semiotic and cognitive analysis of the ancient Syrian, Mesopotamian and Arabian cultural milieu. Since the 90s he has participated in many archaeological excavations, prospections, surveys, and restoration field projects in the Western Asia, Africa and Arabian Peninsula. In Syria, he has been the area supervisor of excavations and coordinated different interdisciplinary scientific teams for the planning and opening of the Ebla (Tell Mardikh) Archaeological Park.

2. Education: Marco Ramazzotti graduated at La Sapienza University of Rome (1996) in Near Eastern Archaeology and Art History, he took PhD (2002) and Specialization (2005) in the Archaeology of the Ancient Near East at La Sapienza, with honors. Research fellow in Computer Science at Semeion Research Center of Rome since 1994 and researcher in Near Eastern Archaeology and Art History since 2007, he teaches as Associate Professor and follows bachelor's degree students, master's degree students, specialization's degree students and PhD students in Near Eastern Archaeology and Art History and in Museums and Archaeological Parks Valorization.
